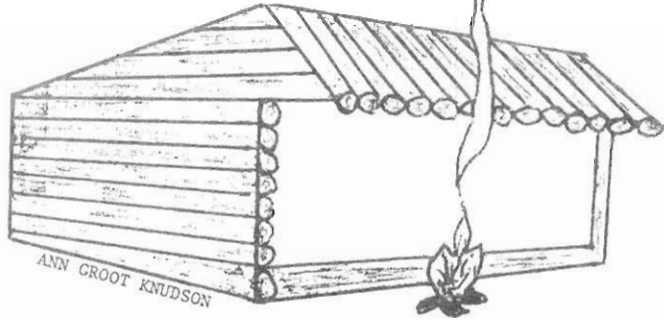

## 46<sup>TH</sup> ANNUAL IOCA CONFERENCE

22-24 APRIL 1977 - ONEONTA, NEW YORK

IOCA CONFERENCE is scheduled to take place at Oneonta State College's summer field camp outside Oneonta, New York. The IOCA CONFERENCE site is a 198-acre patch of countryside, located not very far from rock climbing (Little Falls area), whitewater and canoeing (Susquehanna, Schoharie and Esopus watercourses), hiking (Catskills' Escarpment Trail, etc.), caving (Schoharie County, etc.) and of course the other usual CONFERENCE weekend activities.

There will be more than enough tent space for all of IOCA at CONFERENCE! Meals will be served in the camp lodge. Registration for this year's meeting is slightly cheaper over the 1976 gathering - \$12.00 per body. There was no mention of advanced preregistration procedures, so I'll assume you may register upon arrival.

As usual, there will be no meal prepared on Friday evening; early arrivals may have to invade the Oneonta business district, I reckon. Bring tents, rain gear, cross-country skis, snowshoes, kayaks, canoes, etc. Oneonta Outing Club mentioned they will provide a shuttle service to run canoeists and kayakers back to their vehicles on the Susquehanna River outings.

IOCA CONFERENCE weekend schedule looks like the following:

FRIDAY, 22 April 2-10 p.m. - Registration (\$12 per person), Camp Lodge. Local outings planning, plus any informal (?) meetings on aspects of IOCA, outing clubs, etc.

SATURDAY, 23 April 7:30 a.m. - BREAKFAST!!! Also registration for late arrivals, such as myself!

9 a.m. to 6 p.m. - TRIPS, TRIPS and more TRIPS! Bag lunches offered in the usual IOCA fashion will be available for pickup after breakfast.

6 p.m. - SUPPER!!! Saturday supper will start at 6 p.m. and for the benefit of *Ellis Lader* and others who should happen to go off on a bushwhacking trip in the Catskills, Oneonta Outing Club said they will keep supper warm for those who drag in late.

6-8 p.m. - ANNUAL IOCALum MEETING!!! In order to cover everything in our business meeting (proposed statement revision, election of IOCALum Secretary, Fall Lake George discussion, etc.), let's plan on wolfing down the food at a common gathering somewhere in the lodge. Actual voting will take place after everyone has stuffed themselves!

8 p.m. to ? - SQUARE DANCE!!!

SUNDAY, 24 April 8 a.m. - Breakfast (yawn!)

9 a.m. or thereabouts - general IOCA meeting(s); nominations and elections of undergraduate IOCA officers, selection of this summer's COLLEGE WEEK site and next year's IOCA CONFERENCE site and/or host outing club.

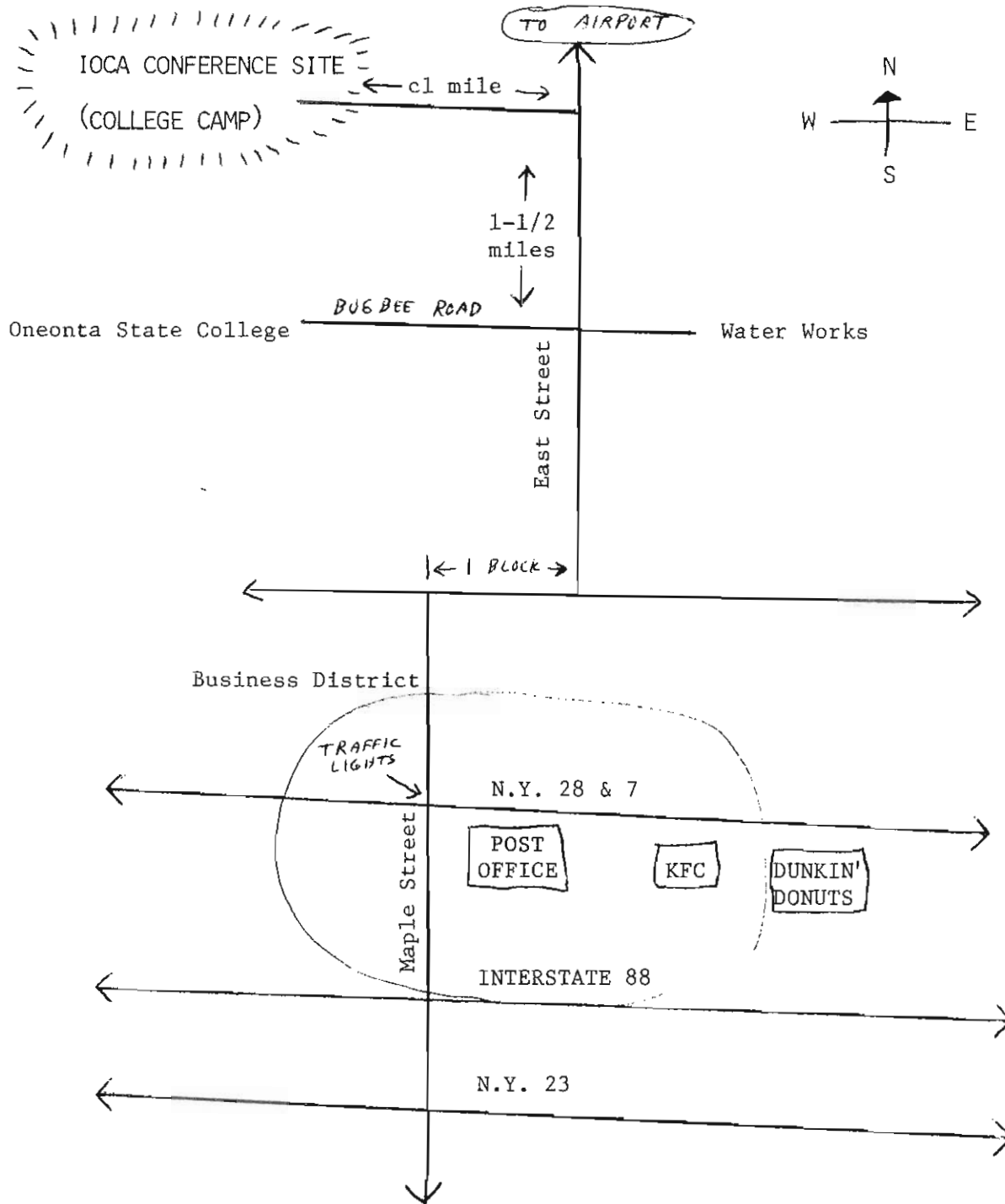
1 p.m. - Lunch, CONFERENCE photograph, acknowledgement of *Lew Levy's* performance as IOCA Executive Secretary this past year (i.e. - "splash party!"), and preparations for vacating the site.

Campaign speech (sort of): Yes, I will be more than happy to serve another term as IOCALum Secretary, since many of you have expressed that desire, although I'll be happy to serve again, anyway, since it has been a lot of fun! HOWEVER, and I must stress this point, if you folks feel that it is time for a change or someone is interested in improving my efforts, then by all means select a new secretary - I certainly will not object! Contrary to the opinions of some members, I do not ego trip; therefore you may rest assured that I will not be unhappy with the results of the IOCALum meeting.

DIRECTIONS to Conference:

Oneonta may be reached via state route 7 from Binghamton, N.Y. (if you're traveling from the southern states; take Interstate 81 north to Binghamton); state route 7 from Schenectady, N.Y. (if you're driving down from the Northeast region; take Interstate 90 west to Schenectady); westerners may pick up I-81 from Pennsylvania or Virginia and head north to Binghamton, or travel east to western New York State and reach Oneonta via state route 17 east to Binghamton, or take I-90 east to Syracuse and continue on to Herkimer, turning south on state route 28 to Oneonta. If you're as confused as I am on these directions, consult a New York state road map!

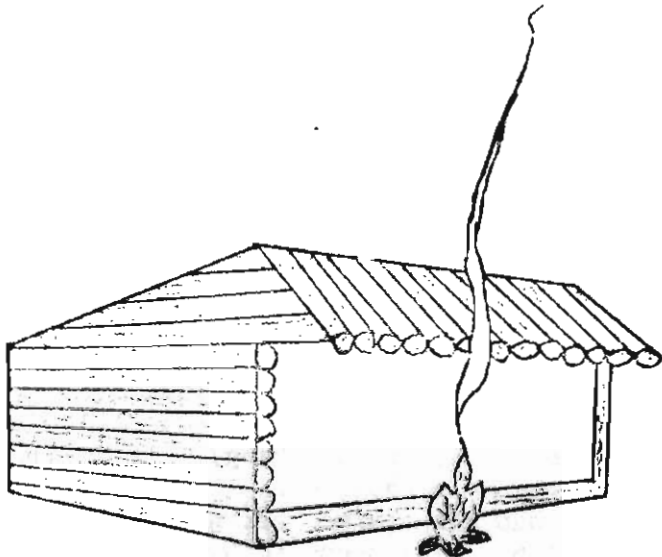
